# **New JACC- a growing movement!**

After five years of assessing the needs of the Southeast Alaska arts and culture community and outlining the specs needed for a state-of-the-art facility, community leaders assembled to form the Partnership Board, which has undertaken the task of raising \$26M to support construction of the New Juneau Arts and Culture Center (New JACC).

Much has happened in the last two years! We have three parttime staff and several consultants. We have a design! Thank you NorthWind and Hacker Architects. We have raised 17% of the \$26M needed for the New JACC.

Fundraising has been robust, continuous and enthusiastically embraced by over 25 talented volunteers. This team has researched prospects, undertaken nearly 100 solicitations with more underway. 

Architect Spotlight: Sean Boily, AIA -Principal Architect, North Wind Architects

been intimately involved with all aspects of the design from day one, orchestrating the broad team of theater specialists, consultant engineers and NorthWind's design partner, HACKER Architects out of Portland, Oregon. Sean is a life-long Alaskan. Raised in Homer, he received his Bachelors of Architecture at University of Oregon, returned to Alaska to practice architecture in the early 1990's and opened NorthWind in 2005. He prizes excellent design that positively affects how we live, where we live, and architecture that successfully responds to both our evolving social landscape and rigorous regional climates.

Deeply committed to enhancing the quality of arts and educational spaces in Juneau, Sean is personally active in supporting arts and culture in the community, having served on the Board of the Juneau Arts and Humanities Council, assisted in the development of the JAHC annual Wearable Art fundraising event for more than a decade and led the development of the Canvas Community Art Center. He has served as architect for several Juneau School District projects including the renovation of Gastineau and Glacier Valley Elementary Schools and more recently led the NorthWind/HACKER team that designed the Mendenhall Valley Library. Presently he is a Board Director representing Southeast Alaska for the Alaska Design Forum, and serves on the board of the Juneau Downtown Business Association.
